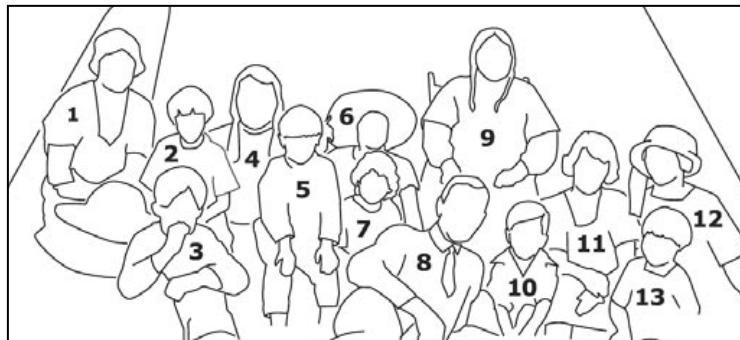




A Visit to the Chief FORT HALL INDIAN RESERVATION, GIBSON, IDAHO · CIRCA 1920

Pearl Bennett was active in teaching members of the Shoshone Bannock tribe for several years. According to her daughter, Vilate Bennett Whitehead—the little girl identified by the number two—the chief deeply appreciated Pearl’s teaching abilities.
